



Risk Management Policy

Purpose

This policy is designed to outline a framework for the control, minimization, or elimination of the risks associated with the SWVFA's activities.

Policy Statements

Risks are inherent in every element of community sport and Football specifically, and SWVFA recognizes the role of appropriate risk management as essential to providing our activities to SWVFA members in a safe and controlled manner.

Our Risk Management strategy is a systematic process that enables the identification, assessment, communication, and minimization/removal of risks that can negatively influence the organization, our environment, and our members.

The effective implementation of the Risk Management Policy requires a consistent and systematic approach to risk management at all levels SWVFA operations.

Procedures

SWVFA will adhere to the following procedures to manage inherent risks of our activities:

- 1) Encourage the ongoing identification/reporting of potential risks to all members of the Committee and wider SWVFA community.
- 2) Identify, report, and evaluate the liability associated with all risks.
- 3) Establish the extent of all identified risks.
- 4) Record all risks through a risk management plan/register as shown below.
- 5) Develop and implement ongoing strategies to mitigate, minimize or eliminate risks.
- 6) Support and promote a culture of risk management practices.
- 7) Reduce the cost of insurance premiums and instances of any potential claims.
- 8) Protect the reputation, brand, and image of the SWVFA.



The risk management systems will be reviewed regularly to ensure the actions remain appropriate and effective.

Risk Management Action Plan

The following plan (listed at Appendix 1) has been developed in accordance with the above Risk Management Policy to maintain a record of identified risks, the responses, and necessary actions taken as a result.

Risk Priority

1. **EXTREME** Likely to arise and have potentially serious consequences requiring urgent attention
2. **MAJOR** Likely to arise and have potentially serious consequences requiring urgent attention or investigation
3. **MEDIUM** Likely to arise or have serious consequences requiring attention
4. **MINOR** Risks and low consequences that maybe managed by routine procedures

If misconduct indicates imminent escalation player to be removed immediately.
